**What it is:** Safer Caterpillar Killer is the natural choice for controlling leaf-eating caterpillars. Caterpillars stop feeding shortly after eating foliage sprayed with Caterpillar Killer and die within a few days. Caterpillar Killer does not harm honey bees or beneficial arthropods and does not harm earthworms.

**(For Ornamental Trees and Shrubs) What it Controls:** Tent Caterpillars, Gypsy Moth Larvae, Budworms, Bagworms, Spanworms, spring and fall Canker worms and other leaf-eating caterpillars.

**How to Use it:** Mix 1 to 2 teaspoons of Caterpillar Killer per gallon of water. For high population and larger larvae of gypsy moths and budworms, use up to 4 teaspoons per gallon of water.

**(For Tomatoes and Vegetables) What it Controls:** Imported Cabbage Worms, Cabbage Loopers, Tomato Homworms, Tent Caterpillars, Webworms, and other leaf-eating caterpillars on cole crops, celery, lettuce, spinach, peanuts, peas, tomatoes and avocados.

**How to Use it:** Mix 1 to 2 teaspoons of Caterpillar Killer per gallon of water. Repeat as necessary up to day of harvest.

**(For all states except California)**

**Storage and Disposal:**

**Storage:** Store in tightly closed container between 20 to 90 degrees F.

**Disposal:** To dispose of unused product, securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash. Do not reuse empty container. Rinse thoroughly before discarding in trash.
